RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

At St Margaret Mary's, we believe that Religious Education is central to our mission.

- Through our teaching and actions, we affirm the faith development of the whole school community, and both strengthen and challenge the faith of all individuals.
- Religious education provides the Gospel Values by which one can live.
- We affirm and promote the faith development of the whole school community.
- We believe that Religious Education, based on Jesus' lifestyle and teachings is fundamental to everything we do.
- We enrich students' faith and spiritual development through the teaching of the beliefs, history, and traditions of the Catholic Church.
- We challenge students and staff to live according to Gospel values.
- Our inquiry-based curriculum integrates the principles of Social Justice and Catholic Social Teachings. We emphasise the dignity of every individual, the pursuit of the common good, and the importance of subsidiarity and participation.
- Preferential option for the poor guides our actions, and we instil values of stewardship for creation and actively promote peace within our community and beyond.

The Sacramental program St Margaret Mary's includes Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. As a part of the preparation for the Sacraments, families are invited to a Family Faith night share some elements of the preparation to support understanding of this important event in your child's life.



Guided Christian Meditation occurs from 8:45-9:00am every Tuesday - Friday, with the whole school community gathering to pause, reflect and pray, starting the day calmly and in the presence of God and each other.

CURRICULUM

Learning is understanding our own and other people's capabilities and reaching our full potential. Learner's question, wonder, play and are open to new experiences. The Victorian Curriculum standards outline required learning for all students in Victoria from Prep to Year 10, describing in detail what students are expected to know and be able to do at each year level. The school uses these standards for program planning and as a benchmark for assessing and reporting on student progress.

Learning Dispositions are taught explicitly with a highlight on collaboration, creativity, resilience, problem solving, self-management, curiosity, perseverance, and reflection.

We offer a balanced curriculum that includes structured core subjects with a synthetic phonics program in the junior years alongside exploration of rich literature. Our play-based approach encourages discovery and inquiry learning across all curriculum areas.

The design of the curriculum as a continuum of learning is intended to ensure schools and teachers use the full continuum to monitor and provide feedback to students on their learning more effectively.

- 1. We cover the eight learning areas of the Victorian Curriculum (English, Mathematics, Science, History, Technologies, The Humanities, Language and The Arts).
- 2. Students are given opportunities to develop the capabilities of Critical and Creative Thinking, Ethical and Intercultural Understanding and Personal and Social Skills and Knowledge.
- **3.** We aim to give our students the life skills they need to manage themselves as individuals and in relation to others, to understand the world in which they live and act effectively in it.




STUDENT WELLBEING

Buddy Program

St Margaret Mary's Prep - Year Six Buddy Program is a heart-warming initiative designed to foster a sense of community and support among students of different age groups. This program pairs older students, typically in Year Six, with younger ones entering Prep or in the early years of primary school.

The intention behind the Buddy Program is to create a positive and inclusive school environment where everyone feels valued and connected. The older buddies serve as role models and friends for the younger ones, offering guidance, encouragement, and a helping hand as they navigate their early years of education.

Overall, the Prep to Year Six Buddy Program is a wonderful embodiment of the school's commitment to nurturing not just academic growth but also the social and emotional well-being of every student, creating a warm and supportive atmosphere that echoes the school's values of unity and collaboration.



Playground POD

We officially opened our Play Pod in 2021, as an extension of our Discovery program, for all students P-6. This supports explicit teaching of our learning dispositions of collaboration, problem solving, perseverance, resilience, creativity, curiosity, reflection, and self-management.

Restorative Practices

In our classrooms and playground, we employ restorative approaches for behaviour management. When students are involved in behavioural incidents, they're asked restorative questions to explain their perspective and reflect on how their actions affected others, aiming to restore relationships.

Student Voice

Students in all levels can have their say through the Student Representative Council. Students from each class are elected each year to meet with the Principal and lead class meetings to give students a voice on the direction of the school. Student leaders are chosen from Year 6 students. The Student Leaders are elected after a comprehensive Leadership Course held when they were in Year 5. Students can also join Mini Vinnies to support those in need.



School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

We promote a positive, safe, and inclusive learning community. We value and respect individuality and encourage all students to become capable and confident learners. We strive to achieve our personal best and bring out the best in others. PICK UP / DROP OFF & PARKING

- Parents are invited to bring their children in to the yard at the start of the day and to say goodbye when the first bell sounds.
- At the end of the day, gates open at 3:20pm so parents can enter the middle yard to collect their children.
- Parking is available on both Mitchell and Donald Streets and other nearby streets
 please do not park in the church carpark.
- Please follow street signs and refrain from double parking and U-turns outside the school which is a 40km zone.
- Please also model good road safety by using the school crossing on Mitchell Street and say hello to our cheerful Crossing Supervisor, Anna.
- Children who are collected by parents in cars will be kept with a teacher at the school gate, until the parent is legally parked, the child/children will be allowed to walk to the car. We are very vigilant about the safety of our students being safe when picked up after school.

ENROLMENT GUIDELINES

- The parent/guardian/carer submits an Enrolment Application form to the school either online through the website or through a form available from the office.
- The application is reviewed to ensure that it is complete, that all required attachments have been received, the child meets the mini and maximum starting ages, and that it meets the school's enrolment policies and procedures.
- A structured interview with parent/guardian/carer and the child is undertaken.
- As part of the process, the principal or delegate provides enrolment agreement, Parent /Guardian / Carer Code of Conduct, and Student Code of Conduct to parent/guardian/carer and student to review and sign if offered a place. Acceptance and signing of these documents are a condition of enrolment.
- On acceptance of a position at St. Margaret Mary's a \$100.00 non-refundable deposit will be required. This will be taken off the term fees for the enrolment year.

CONCESSIONAL FEES

Concessional fees are available to eligible families upon application. Applications for concessional school fees must be made on the approved form. Forms are available from the office. Information provided in support of concessional school fees is treated in the strictest confidence, in accordance with the school's privacy policy. Families holding a current Health Care Card are eligible to receive further financial assistance with the cost of Camps, Sports, and Excursions. (CSEF)

ATTENDANCE

Parents must inform the school by phone, email, the Audiri app form, or in writing to explain any absences from school. If a child needs to be collected early from school, a note to the teacher or a call to the office would be appreciated. When students leave early (prior to 3:30pm) or arrive late (after 9:00am), parents or auardians are asked to come to the office to speak to a staff member so their child can be signed in or out. A follow up phone call will be made to parents for students not accounted for by 9:30am each day.

SCHOOL HOME COMMUNICATION

- Classroom communication is via the Seesaw app.
- Whole school communication is via the Audiri app.
- <u> A</u> audiri The Newsletter is available online every second Friday. It is available via subscription so that we can include photos of children and maintain privacy. The newsletter contains information such as: Dates to Remember, From the Principal, Curriculum and Learning News, School News, Student News, Community News etc.
- Appointments with teachers can be arranged. Parents can use Seesaw or leave a message at the Office for the teacher.
- Learning journals are available via Seesaw. Learning journals are a collection of student work, learning goals and reflections that richly represent them as a learner and provides authentic evidence of learning.



SUPERVISION

Children are always supervised by staff and all care is taken to ensure the safety of each child during the school day. Parents are reminded that supervision begins when the school gates open at 8:30 a.m. and continues through the day until 3:45pm after school.

All parents/guardians are asked to enrol their children in After School Care if they feel they will not be able to collect their child by this time. We do understand that there may be an occasional day that parents/guardians are held up - a call to the school to let us know would be appreciated and we can then make appropriate arrangements.



We take our duty of care very seriously. Procedures and first aid training of staff are in place to assist and treat children if necessary. Parents will always be informed.

SAFETY MEDICAL PROCEDURES

Clear procedures to maintain the safety and well-being of all students are set out in the school's Child Safety Policies. In the case of illness, children are cared for and made as comfortable as possible. Parents or contact persons are informed so that the student is taken home where possible. In cases of minor injury/illness the office will complete an Illness/Accident Report Form. This will be sent home with the child.

MEDICAL AUTHORISATION

Staff require written authorisation and instructions for any medicines administered to children. We ask that you complete the Medical Authority Form whenever your child requires medication (this includes OTC and prescribed medication). All medication must be in a container which is clearly marked with procedures for administration. The medication will be kept in the school's office and administered to your child as per the instructions on the Medical Authority Form.

ASTHMA AND ANAPHYLAXIS MANAGEMENT PLANS

The school aims to provide a safe and supportive environment in which students at risk of asthma or anaphylaxis can participate equally in all aspects of the student's schooling. An Individual Medical Plan must be set in place so that appropriate medical procedures can be followed should your child have an attack. Teachers and other school staff have current training to handle the situation should your child need medical attention.

SUNSMART

Students must wear a school hat in both Term 1 and Term 4 as part of our SunSmart Policy. Students who do not wear hats must remain in the shaded area of the school where play is restricted. Students should also bring their own sunscreen to school. School hats are available from the school uniform shop.

ABSENTEES

Class teachers must account for each child and record reasons for absences in electronic school attendance roles. As a legal requirement, we ask that parents provide an explanation for your child's absence from school. When children are absent from, or late for school, parents are asked to contact the school by either visiting the office, email, or phone. If your child is late, they will need to sign in on arrival at the Office. A phone call will be made to parents not accounted for by9.30am each day.

ANIMALS

Animals, particularly dogs, are loved by many and have many benefits. Some children and adults, however, have fears and allergies that need to be respected. If you are bringing an animal to school, it must be leashed and firmly under an adult handler's control. Children are under no circumstances to be allowed to crowd an animal so that it feels threatened, and the handler must manage this. Families may be asked to remove an animal and to have it remain away as the safety of all children and adults is our top priority.



ASSEMBLIES

School assemblies are held every Monday morning between 8:45 and 9:00 a.m. We gather for an Acknowledgement of Country, Morning Prayer, the National Anthem, School Wide Positive Behaviour rewards, birthdays, and weekly reminder announcements.

We love to see our parents and other family members at assembly so please come along!

SCHOOL LUNCHES

The children will need to bring lunch with them each day including a fruit snack to consume at 10:00 am, a main component to eat just before 11:00 am, and a snack to eat just after 1:30 pm. We encourage healthy food choices, and it is our policy to only have water in drink bottles which may be consumed at any time the day.



We are conscious that everyone likes variety and that parents are busy people. Parents can order lunch from D1Uno, a local café, through the Qkr! app on Tuesday and Fridays each week (instructions are sent home to guide parents through this process)

BIRTHDAYS

We love to help children celebrate their birthday, but we recommend that, if you are bringing a cake in (not compulsory) that it be in the form of cupcakes, as this makes sharing easier. Please no extras (lolly bags, balloons etc.) as we are trying to maintain healthy eating habits in our school. All birthdays are acknowledged at assemblies and in the school newsletter.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

All children are expected to wear the school uniform. Parents can order uniforms via the school office, alternatively go directly to our suppliers A Plus Schoolwear.
